PE and Sports Premium Grant	
Key priorities: To improve the Physical Education (PE) and sports programs offered by Primary schools	
What is the PE and Sports Group Premium? From September 2017, the Government doubled the funding to primary schools to £320 million to increase, support and facilitate physical activity. The school received £16,000, with an additional payment of £10 per registered pupil. This funding is specifically 'ring fenced' for use in PE and schools will be held to account for how they spend their additional funding.

How will impact be measured?

High quality PE teaching and learning

- Pupils are receiving lessons from a specialised PE member of staff from the Academy Trust in Years R-6 and children are using the facilities at Uffculme School for additional sporting opportunities.

Assessment of Progress

- Progress monitored and recorded through a scheme of work called Create Development, allowing continuity on transition to secondary school provision.

Observations of children and staff during PE lessons.

- Lessons to be observed formally by Senior Leadership team to ensure that the quality of lesson is as high as possible

Greater participation for all children in sporting events

- Children to be given the opportunity to take part in many activities both inside and outside of lesson time.
- Targeting a broader spectrum of children taking part in school sport beyond the curriculum.

Outcomes to date (2017-2018):

Children in Year R-6 have benefited from receiving specialised PE teaching. Throughout the school year they have covered a range of sporting activities, covering one activity within each half-term. The range of activities has been developed so that each pupil has had the opportunity to advance their skills and gain an interest that may continue outside of school. These units have included invasion games, net/wall games, gymnastics, dance, strike/fielding games and athletics. The schedule of activities can be seen on the schools PE curriculum map on the school's website. The lessons are of a consistently high standard, graded as outstanding each term.

Additionally, over the year children have been able to participate in; -

- Cross country and orienteering using Magelake facilities
- Orienteering event at Killerton House
- Years 3/4/5/6 Football
- Regular participation within the Uffculme Cluster Primary sports events and

central venue leagues organised through Uffculme Academy Trust

- Key Stage One Multi Skills Events
- Supporting Bikeability in Year 5
- Year 6 Tag Rugby Tournament Uffculme School
- CVSA Swimming gala at Tiverton Pool
- CVSA Athletics Meeting based at Exeter Arena
- Children have taken part in a range of sports tournaments and festivals – including cage football, basketball, High 5's Netball, Rounders, Cricket, Tennis and golf.
- An increasing level of performance in Culm Valley and East Devon Primary school competitions with the school often coming out with a top 3 placing in a variety of sports.
- 70% of children in school have taken part in a Culm Valley Cluster competition this year representing a 10% increase from last year. 77% of KS2 children have taken part and 66% of KS1 Children have been to a competition.
- In Year 6, all children have reached their target grade ready for transition into Uffculme School: 23% of children working above age-related expectations; 61% of children working at age-related expectations; 16% working below age-related expectations
- There have been a number of Extra-curricular Sports clubs provided or organised this year that have been very successful. 53% of all pupils have accessed at least of the clubs during the year. KS2 especially with 65% of pupils taking part in at least one club.
- 51% of all pupil premium children have accessed an extra-curricular sports club this year.
- 43% of SEN pupils had benefitted from an extra-curricular sports club either during lunch or after school.
- 68% of Pupil premium children had competed for the school at a Culm Valley Cluster competition.
- 65% of pupils with SEN needs had taken part at a CVLC competition this year.
- Sports day run successfully with all pupils taking part in at least two events across all year groups.

How we intend to spend the 2018/19 PPG:

Staffing:

- Continue to funding a specialist member of staff to deliver a high quality PE curriculum in EYFS, KS1 & KS2 as well as working alongside colleagues to develop their confidence and subject knowledge.
- Continued provision of play leaders at lunchtime to support active involvement of children in games using Year 5 and 6 children
- Organisation of CVLC Athletics event through Uffculme Primary School staff.
- Improving the quality of the extra-curricular football club through increased participation including the development of a new girls only club.
- Improving the relationship between the two schools in the partnership through the use of JSLA Leaders and D of E volunteers to run/assist with school clubs.

Resourcing:

- Enabling children to take part in all the activities run by the Culm Valley Schools Sports Programme this year in their programme of events e.g. by providing transport and release for staff to attend where necessary
- Funding additional sporting equipment.
- Supporting externally delivered dance provision for KS1 & KS2 children
- Increasing the number of extra-curricular clubs available to all children
