Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you all have had a lovely Christmas break and wishing you a Happy New Year!

Please find attached an overview of the curriculum that we will be studying this term. It also includes some ideas about how you can support your child's learning at home.

As you can see from the timetable, P.E is on Wednesdays and Thursdays, so the children need to have their P.E kit in school on these days (although we do advise that they bring them in on Mondays and then leave them in school until Friday when they should be taken home to be washed). A reminder that your child needs: black shorts, red polo-shirt and daps. When the weather is colder they may need black tracksuit bottoms. For health and safety reasons, jewellery must be removed for P.E; this includes ear-rings.

Water bottles and Snack reminders

Please can you send a water bottle into school every day for your child. It is really important that they have access to water throughout the day and a bottle in the classroom ensures that water is readily available.

If your child would like a snack at break time, they can bring in a piece of fruit or veg from home.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework is an integral part of your child's learning. The homework set allows your child to consolidate what has been learnt in school and extend their learning further. Any support you can give them is valuable.

Your child has a <u>reading book</u>. They will have to complete a quiz in school based on the book before they are able to change it (they need to achieve 80% or above). It would be of benefit to your child if you could spend some time each evening supporting them with their reading. Please use the Reading Record booklet to record when you and your child read at home.

Homework will be given out on Fridays and collected in on Thursdays.

On a weekly basis your child will be expected to complete:

- 30 minutes on Spellodrome playing the games and learning the spellings.
- A My Maths activity. Ideally your child needs to achieve a green at the end of the activity. If they don't they will need to try the activity again, after completing the related lesson.
