We know that we have only just started school, but we are so impressed with how well your children have come into their new class. It can be very tiring for children as they are experiencing so many new rules and routines, but they are all doing brilliantly. We are all really looking forward to the year ahead.

We have included a list of the curriculum areas of learning and a brief explanation of what we will be covering during each area in the table below. This is a flexible plan and highlights the main focuses for this half term. Our children lead learning and things will change in response to their interests and needs.



Our current topic for this half term is 'Our World and the seasons'. We are learning:

Communication and Language	Developing listening skills and behaviours. Engaging in story times and non-fiction books by following along and joining in. Developing talking about own experiences and learning new vocabulary. Thinking about asking and answering questions and talking in full sentences. Hearing and saying social phrases e.g. 'Good morning', 'Can I help you?'			
Personal, Social	Transitioning into school and learning the school routines.			
and Emotional	Getting to know our teachers and the children in our class.			
Development	Becoming more independent with putting away belongings, dressing and toileting.			
	Expressing our own feelings and developing confidence to try new activities. Practising turn taking and sharing resources.			
	Making healthy choices and learning how to care for ourselves e.g. washing hands, drinking water and eating healthily.			
Physical Development	Developing our gross motor skills including balancing, throwing and catching. Changing direction with increasing speed and control. Developing good posture and muscle strength.			
	Developing our fine motor skills including using cutlery, using tweezers to pick up small objects, practising doing zips and buttons, threading and weaving and developing finger strength in our playdough disco sessions. Practising using scissors to cut straight and curved lines and using a paintbrush			
	effectively. Developing a tripod pencil grip to draw pictures, write our names and form letters correctly.			
PE	This term we will be looking at improving our agility, coordination and balance. We will be learning some invasion games, such as football, netball, basketball and others, to help us to improve this.

HOMEWORK IN RECEPTION

Reading and phonics

At Uffculme Primary School, we place a huge importance upon reading and the joy of sharing books with each other. The children enjoy having lots of stories everyday in class and there is a wide selection of books in the classroom which the children can choose from. The school library is an excellent resource where children can look for books linked to current themes and topics.

Every child begins school with different reading experiences, and it is a really exciting time when the children start to read and write. Our aim in the first few weeks is to establish your child's 'next steps' to support their reading development. We will also be starting our Little Wandle phonics lessons. Below is a brief outline of the phonics



programme that we will be focusing on this half-term. More information about early reading and phonics and how you can support this at home, will follow in the next few weeks.

Phonics programme

This programme shows the progression of GPC's (grapheme-phoneme-correspondence) and tricky words that we will teach over the first half-term in Reception. All of the graphemes taught are practised in words, sentences, and later on, in fully decodable reading books. Children review and revise GPC's and words, daily, weekly and across terms and years, in order to move this knowledge into their long-term memory.

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Wow Moments



Over the next few weeks, we will also put some 'Wow Moment' slips into your child's bookbag. You can use these to let us know about your child's achievements and learning out of school. It might be for example that your child can now put on their coat independently or that you visited a local park recently that they really enjoyed. We love to hear about all of the children's achievements so please do write these 'Wow moments' on the slips provided and put them into your child's bookbag. We will then share and celebrate these moments together as a class.

Water bottles and snack

Please can you send a water bottle into school every day for your child. It is really important that they have access to water throughout the day and a bottle in the classroom ensures that water is readily available (no squash or juice please). Please label the bottle with your child's name. Your child will be provided with a piece of fruit or vegetable every day for snack but if your child would like to bring in their own snack instead, they can bring in a piece of fruit or veg from home.

PE and Music

PE lessons will be taken by Mr Carpanini and will be on a Thursday and Friday, starting on Thursday 21st September. Children will need to have their PE kit in school on these days. A reminder that your child needs: black shorts, red poloshirt and daps. When the weather is colder, they may need black tracksuit bottoms. Please ensure that all PE kit is clearly labelled and carried in a named bag. For health and safety reasons, jewellery must be removed for P.E; this includes earrings.



Mrs Pethick will be teaching the children Music on Wednesdays. Both Mr Carpanini and Mrs Pethick are experienced teachers and are looking forward to teaching the children.
