## **Updates & Reminders**

Thank you to all those who attended the **Online Safety Workshop** on Tuesday. Ensuring your child is safe online is vitally important, and the best way parents can achieve this is by fostering open and positive discussions around this topic with their children. Monitoring your child's activity online is also hugely beneficial as we need to stay ahead of what they are accessing and ensure they are not being exposed to inappropriate content. They also asked us to pass on their apologies to the school community as whole so we wanted to let you know what had happened and that South West Water have done what they can to make up for the incident which occurred.
